Why I Took the EDiMSK

I took the EDiMSK examination because I wanted to challenge myself and develop a stronger foundation in musculoskeletal radiology. MSK is an area that I have become increasingly interested in, and I wanted to benchmark my knowledge against an international standard.

For me, the examination was not simply about obtaining a qualification. It was an opportunity to identify gaps in my knowledge, push myself beyond what I was comfortable with, and ultimately become a better radiologist.

How I Prepared

My preparation was very deliberate. I worked through a number of musculoskeletal radiology textbooks, attended several MSK courses, and undertook an MSK radiology observer-ship at Oxford University Hospitals. I also made extensive use of the ESSR e-learning platform, particularly the recorded webinars and past congress presentations.

I regularly attend MSK multidisciplinary team meetings, which have allowed me to learn not only from experienced radiologists, but also from orthopaedic surgeons. These discussions have helped me better understand the clinical context of imaging findings and how our reports contribute to patient management.

I have also been fortunate to work alongside a group of experienced radiologists, each of whom has taught me something different. Their experience, feedback and approach to cases have been an important part of my development.

Overall, I tried to approach every case as an opportunity to learn. Whether it was a straightforward examination or a challenging case, I tried to understand not only what the diagnosis was, but why the findings led to that diagnosis.



Why It Matters for My Career

The EDiMSK is important to me because it represents both a milestone and a foundation for further development in MSK radiology.

It has helped me develop greater confidence in my knowledge and, perhaps more importantly, has reinforced the habit of continually questioning, learning and improving. I hope to continue developing my MSK expertise and to apply what I have learnt to my day-to-day practice.
